

**City of Lakeside Park**  
**Minutes of 5/09/2022**  
**Regular Council Meeting**

**CALLED TO ORDER:**

Mayor Markgraf opened the meeting of the Lakeside Park City Council at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, May 9, 2022. The meeting started with the pledge to the flag led by Mr. Wolfer and continued with a prayer by Mr. Waite Those in attendance were Council Members: Mr. Bernheimer, Mr. Grimes, Mrs. Thaman, Mr. Waite and Mr. Wolfer. Mr. Gastright was absent. City Attorney Mr. Voss and Mrs. Hehman were also present for the meeting.

**AGENDA:**

Mr. Wolfer made the **motion** to adopt the agenda as presented. Mrs. Thaman seconded the **motion** Voice vote was taken. **5 Ayes, 1 Absent. Motion** carried.

**MINUTES:**

Council having received copies of the 4/11/22 Council Meeting minutes was asked for any additions or corrections. Mr. Waite made the **motion** to adopt the minutes as amended. The title for Mr. Waite, under the Police Authority, was corrected. Mr. Bernheimer seconded the **motion**. Voice vote was taken. **5 Ayes, 1 Absent. Motion** carried.

**CITIZENS ADDRESSING COUNCIL:**

**MAYOR'S REPORT:**

Mayor Markgraf's budget message is included in the budget packet, along with the proposed fiscal year budget. The finance committee proposed paying half of the waste fee in the upcoming budget, as it was received last year. Mayor Markgraf noted due to rising fuel costs, we may face fuel surcharges in the future. The Mayor's Group will be hosted by Erlanger on Saturday, May 21, at 9:00 a.m. The June Mayors Group will be hosted by Lakeside Park. Mayor Markgraf reported the resignation of City Clerk/Treasurer, Katie Hehman. Mayor Markgraf reminded neighbors to follow the Nuisance Ordinance, and to avoid a citation by keeping lawns below 8 inches, and avoid leaving grass clippings in the streets and sidewalks.

**LEGAL:**

Mr. Voss conducted the first reading of Ordinance 2 - 2022 Adopting Annual Budget for FY July 1, 2022-June 30, 2023.

Mr. Voss conducted a Resolution 1-2022 Authorizing for the Standard Allowance for ARPA Funds. Mrs. Thaman made a **motion** to adopt Resolution 1-2022. Mr. Wolfer seconded the **motion**. Roll Call was taken. **5 Ayes. 1 Absent. Motion** carried.

Mrs. Hehman reported that ARPA Report for expenditures was filed with the Treasury.

**FIRE/EMS:**

The monthly report is in the record book. Assistant Chief Jansing reported there were 12 runs to Lakeside Park for the Month of April

Mayor Markgraf read a proclamation for Mr. David Jansing honoring his 15 years of service to the City. Mr. Bernheimer made the **motion** to accept the proclamation as presented. Mr. Waite seconded the **motion** Voice vote was taken. **5 Ayes, 1 Absent. Motion** carried.

**PUBLIC WORKS:**

The monthly report is in the record book. Mrs. Thaman reviewed the report from CT Consultants. The work on the Lakeview Force Main along Buttermilk Pike is finally completed. She reported there will be a preconstruction meeting with TMS. Updates on the project will be shared on the website.

Kenning Lawncare will be completing the final yard restoration on Paul Hesser.

CT will be preparing 5-year street plan.

**POLICE AUTHORITY:**

The monthly report is in the record book. Mr. Waite reviewed the most recent meeting minutes. There is an open position and the department is advertising to fill the opening. Mr. Waite reported a 90% drop in applicants, which is dramatically less since last year.

**PDS:**

The monthly reports are in the record book. No additional report.

**FINANCE:**

The monthly report is in the record book. Mr. Wolfer highlighted some details for the month of April. The City collected \$88,173.93 in income. The total expenses for the month were \$266,594.18. The majority expenses were for Public Safety. The net loss for the month about \$178,420.25. The checks all appear to be properly recorded. The total in checking and savings is roughly \$2.5 million.

**RECREATION:**

The monthly report is in the record. Mrs. Thaman reported on upcoming events. The Easter Egg hunt was a huge success. The Senior Games are open to anyone 50+ and details for all the events are available on the website.

The annual yard sale is scheduled for May 21<sup>st</sup>. RSVP if you wish to be included on the list. The Large Item Garbage pickup is scheduled for June 4<sup>th</sup>. BINGO hosted at the Lakeside Park City Building in June.

The Armed Forces 5K is scheduled for May 21<sup>st</sup>. There will also be a grill-out the night before to welcome any troops that have come into town for the event.
